CUET 15th July 2022 Shift 1 Question Paper - Analysis

Student Reactions - As per students, the question paper was okay. The level was moderately tough. There were RC based questions, analytical type both. Those who studied well from NCERT found the paper easy.

General Test - Students were worried about the section as there was no fixed book-based syllabus. But they found it easy to moderate. There were not many reasoning questions. There were GK based questions. The current affairs questions were of very recent events. Static GK questions were less.

Which papers were held today - Different students had different papers today. Some of the papers were general test, teaching aptitude, english, hindi, business studies, legal studies, political science, sociology, maths, geography.

English -

- It was easy.
- Reading comprehensions were easier than CBSE board exams.
- Grammar - Easy. There were questions on synonyms, antonyms, figure of speech, sequence in sentences.

Sociology

- Easier than mock test.
- Comprehension based questions were there.
- Questions were directly from NCERT.
- There was a question on who wrote this book.

Legal Studies - Arbitrations and mediations was moderate, rest was easier.

Maths - The paper was moderate. It was not of JEE level. It was much easier than JEE Mains. The only difficulty was to attempt 40 questions in 45 minutes. So it was lengthy but not difficult.

Political Science - All NCERT based questions. Mostly case based questions. There were two cases, from which questions were asked.

Business Studies - More application based questions.

In this shift, each student has appeared in one language from section IA, maximum 2 domain specific subjects from section II and 1 general test from section III.
